

Homework expectation for Maple class 23-24:

Reading for 10 minutes a day

Times table practice 5 minutes a day

No more than 30 minutes of Mathletics per week

30 minutes a week on a selected homework task

This half term (Spring 1) you need to complete 5 of the homework activities:

<u>Animal digestion</u> Choose an animal and research its digestive system, draw a diagram with labels.	<u>What's that tooth?</u> Look at your own teeth or someone else in your household; what different teeth are there? Why are they shaped like that? Research the different types of human teeth. You can make a diary entry/leaflet/poster/other to show your research.	<u>Food Chains</u> Create a food chain showing the transfer of energy between organisms. You can draw/create your food chain how you like; use Lego, soft toys, pictures, drawings, writing.	<u>Healthy plates</u> Work together with people at home to make your dinner plate nutritionally balanced based on the Eatwell plate – take a photo/write/draw to explain your plate.
<u>Healthy body and mind</u> Follow a yoga tutorial. Write some sentences to answer: How it made you feel? Why? Did you enjoy it? Why? Why do you think people do yoga? Would you do yoga again? Why?	<u>Compete with yourself</u> Over at least 2 weeks, set yourself a challenge and compete with yourself. Keep a log of your progress. (like our burpee challenge).	<u>Digestive dance</u> Create your own dance to show how food moves through a human's digestive system. Perform to Miss Thorpe.	

Homework must be submitted each week on a Friday. It will be checked and returned ASAP. If you have any queries about homework please contact Miss Thorpe.

You can present your work in any way you like, but please take your time to ensure you have completed your work to the best of your ability, that you include everything asked of you and that it is presented neatly to a high standard.

Get creative! Great examples of homework tasks will be celebrated in class and will be displayed in school.

Your project should be your own work (help from parents is fabulous and encouraged but the project is yours). Do not submit work copied straight from the Internet/ books (these are brilliant for research but please write in your own words).
