

Homework expectation for Maple class 23-24:

Reading for 10 minutes a day

Times table practice 5 minutes a day

No more than 30 minutes of Mathematics per week

30 minutes a week on a selected homework task

This half term (Autumn 1) you can choose from:

Create a table to compare some key geographical information about Italy and the UK. You could gather data about the size of the country, population, type of money, what language do they speak.	Design a new National flag for Italy. Research what may represent the country and think about why you have included certain colours or pictures.	Write an advertisement/create a poster to persuade someone to visit an Italian city. Look up your chosen city and write down why someone should visit.
Imagine you have to leave your home very suddenly, like the refugee in our story. Draw or photograph 3 items you would like to take with you. Write about why you would like them with you/why are they important to you?	Imagine a new child is joining the class, they cannot speak English. To help make friends with them, draw a self portrait and draw some things to describe you; what are your hobbies, likes, dislikes.	Interview someone who has been to Italy. You might want to ask them about; what they did, what they liked, what food they ate. Write notes from your interview.

Homework must be submitted each week on a Friday. It will be checked and returned ASAP. If you have any queries about homework please contact Miss Thorpe.

You can present your work in any way you like, but please take your time to ensure you have completed your work to the best of your ability, that you include everything asked of you and that it is presented neatly to a high standard.

Your project should be your own work (help from parents is fabulous and encouraged but the project is yours). Do not submit work copied straight from the Internet/ books (these are brilliant for research but please write in your own words).
